The regular meeting was brought to order at 6:30 pm by Council President Sherman.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS:

- > Belinda Seely requested an answer on the right-of-way request.
- Barb Potter commented many properties within the borough need to be visited by the Zoning Officer.
- > Jean Kohut questioned how many hours the zoning officer worked,
- > Donna Blend had concerns over pools in the borough with no fencing.
- Mandy Stewart is concerned about the manholes on First Street that plug in heavy rain.
 - DPW will be contacted regarding this issue

MINUTES:

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Councilman VanGorden motioned to approve the minutes dated July 21, 2021. Councilman Collins seconded the motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS:

Councilman Collins motioned to accept the financial reports. Councilman Whitney seconded the motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

Councilman Whitney motioned to pay the bills as presented in the amount of \$27,009.92. Councilman Stewart seconded motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.

MUNICIPAL REPORTS:

- ➢ DPW − A written report was reviewed.
 - Question of whether the borough should hire a borough manager to oversee daily operations was discussed.
 - There was also a question as to whether the borough should be mowing the top of the dikes or is this area included in the dike-mowing contract.
- SEWER/WATER A written report was reviewed.
 - Councilwoman Graham stated that Josh was doing a good job. The operators were not contacting her with concerns.
 - An estimate from USG for camering approximately 30,000 feet of lines to determine I & I issues was presented in the amount of \$25,000. It was noted that this was Co-Star pricing, so no other estimates were necessary.
 - Councilman Stewart motioned to accept the estimate from USG for \$25,000 to camera the lines. Councilman Whitney seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken, and the results as follows: Councilman Whitney – YES, Councilman Stewart – YES, Councilman VanGorden – YES, Councilman Collins – YES, and Councilwoman Graham – YES. Motion carried.
 - An estimate for seven (7) new actuators at the sewer plant was presented in the amount of \$8,435.00. A motion to purchase the seven (7) actuators was stated by Councilman VanGorden. Councilman Collins seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken, and the results are as follows: Councilman VanGorden – YES, Councilman Stewart – YES, Councilman Whitney – YES, Councilman Collins – YES and Councilwoman Sherman – YES. Motion carried.

> POLICE

• A written report was presented.

➢ FIRE DEPARTMENT

- \circ The fire department responded to 5-6 fires last month.
- Bingo is running again.
- The department is down to one (1) fire truck because one of the trucks has lost the water pump. A rebuild is in process.

> AUTHORITY-

- The authority would like to complete the line camering before cold weather arrives.
- The camering will provide knowledge of the infiltration issues to help with repairing the I & I issues.
- \circ $\;$ There are holes in the sewer drains that are contributing to the infiltration.
- Manholes in the borough need to have a new fiberglass insert added to help with the infiltration as well.

OLD BUSINESS:

- The low hanging wire at the pool is an issue. Verizon won't set a pole. Verizon will only hang the low-hanging wire on an existing pole.
- There will be no bill for the curb removal at Welch's autobody. However, protocols will be put into place for such decisions moving forward.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Fall clean-up will be September 18, 2021, from 7:00am-10:00am behind the borough office. Tire collection will occur at this time. Please call ahead of time to schedule tire collection.
- The East end of River Street will be closed August 23, 2021, August 30, 2021, for street repairs.
- The TCAB meeting will held in Knoxville at 6:00 pm on Thursday, September 16, 2021. Tim Cleveland will be the guest speaker. Please contact the borough secretary prior to September 1, 2021, to RSVP.
- The Elkland Moose offered to purchase new garbage cans to place throughout the borough. The Moose has donated \$950 for six (6) cans.
 - Councilman VanGorden motioned to pay the shipping costs associated with purchasing the garbage cans. Councilman Collins seconded the motion. All present were in favor. Motion carried.
- Councilman VanGorden questioned if there would be any black topping completed in the borough. The consensus was no, not this year.
- Councilman VanGorden invited all council members to view the wash out along the creek located on North Buffalo. Councilman VanGorden is to bring a cost estimate for repair to the next meeting.
- A motion was made by Councilman Collins to research hiring a borough manager for Elkland Borough. Councilman Stewart seconded the motion.
